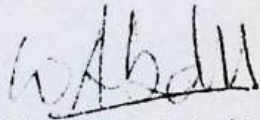

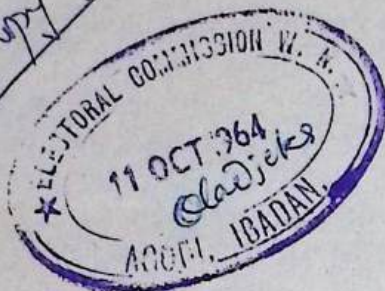

You will recall that I mentioned to you over the telephone some time ago, certain clerical errors which have been pointed out in the Delimitation Report in so far as they affect Ibadan Division, and that the display of the Preliminary Lists of Voters for the constituencies affected should be as corrected.

REPORT OF:

I have been informed by Hon. R.O.A. Akinfide of certain clerical errors which occurred in the Delimitation Commission's report in so far as Western Nigeria constituencies are concerned. The errors were mentioned during the debate on the Report at the last meeting of the Federal Parliament, and were later communicated in writing to the Chairman who, I gather, has undertaken to ensure that necessary corrections are made in the final printing of the Report.

2. Incidentally, the Chairman had mentioned these points to me, and I undertook to prepare the necessary corrections which I now forward as Appendices 1-4.

3. Due note has been taken of these corrections, and we propose to arrange the display of the Preliminary Lists of Voters for Western Nigeria accordingly.

4. My attention has also been called to the description of the District Council area of Ibarapa which forms Constituency No. 259, with particular reference to the Instrument establishing the Council. I have been informed that W.R.L.N. 977 of 1964 has not amended the area of the Council, as that publication is yet a notice of intention. The words "as amended by W.R.L.N. 977 of 1964" should therefore be deleted, and the new description of the Council will then read:

"Constituency No. 259 Ibarapa Population 116,948
consisting of:-

The District Council Area of Ibarapa
(W. R. L. N. 163 of 1954).

5. I shall be grateful if immediate action is taken to ensure that necessary corrections are embodied in the report when it is finally printed.

6. Copies of this letter and its attachment have been forwarded to the Chairman of the Commission, and Dr. J.A. Adagbite, Western Nigeria member, for their information.

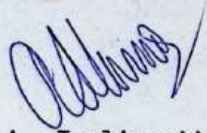

I wish to draw attention to the last sentence of paragraph 114 at page 47 of the Report of Constituency Delimitation Commission, 1964, in respect of Ekiti Division. It would appear there is some confusion in the last line of paragraph 114. Either the sentence should stop after Ekiti South I or the population figures should be related to each of the two constituencies referred to. In other words, the last sentence might read thus :

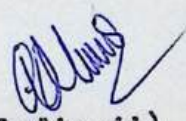
"114. In delimiting Ekiti Division we have accepted the recommendations of the political parties except in the case of Ekiti South Nos. I - II, where we have transferred Emure from Ekiti South II (Population: 135,737) to Ekiti South I (Population: 208,383).

2. Please refer also to the penultimate sentence of paragraph 127 at page 54 of the Report with reference to Oyo Division. Full stop after the word "crossing" should be deleted and the words "District Council boundaries" added. In other words, the sentence should read thus :

"127. One of the constituencies is rather small in population, but it would appear that this position cannot be overcome because the old District Council of Oyo has been divided into two, namely Afijio and Oyo Southern District Council areas, and it is impossible to divide it equally without crossing District Council boundaries.

Having considered all the representations made, we are satisfied that the following arrangement is the most desirable for the Division."

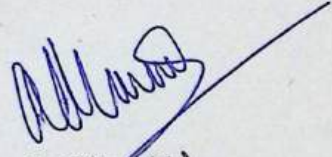

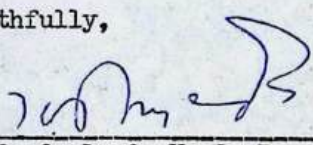

Imini
Oluwatedo
Imeleke

At page 55 of the Delimitation Report, Oyo East Constituency is described as covering the wards of Oyo Town 1 - XXVIII and Ikoyi I-VI. Similarly Oyo South Constituency is described as covering the District Council area of Afijo. (W.N.L.N. 345 of 1964). According to this description the area of Afijo covers the following villages Awe, Akinmorin, Fiditi, Ilora, Iware, Jobele, Iluaje and Ojutaiye.

2. The non-inclusion of Imini, Oluwatedo and Imeleke villages in any Constituency is obviously a regrettable omission. As these villages are wards in Oyo Southern District Council Area, they may be included in Oyo East Constituency. But this may make the Oyo East Constituency too large and it is advisable that for the purpose of this election the three villages be included in Oyo South Constituency.

3. I should be glad for an urgent decision on this matter as it would be dangerous to disenfranchise the people of these villages numbering about 4,000 voters.

Thank you for your circular letter No. S.7/3/43 of the 7th of January, 1966, its attachment and the separate map. The actual delimitation on the map does not correspond with the delimitation in the report. The following discrepancies are noticeable:

- (i) Oyo South (Constituency 294) which is to consist of the District Council area of the Afijio Provisional Authority has been altogether misplaced. It is located in its entirety on the map in the Okeho/Iganna District Council area. Oyo East is thus made to embrace Oyo South.
- (ii) Oyo Central (Constituency 290) is diminished in size on the map and does not embrace the whole of the Iseyin District Council area. The town of Komu with its farmsteads has been placed in Constituency 293 whereas it should be in Constituency 290.
- (iii) Subject to the reservation made in (ii) above, constituencies 293 and 294 should be merged to form 293 and 294 should be excised from 291.

2. I hope that it would be possible to print an amendment.

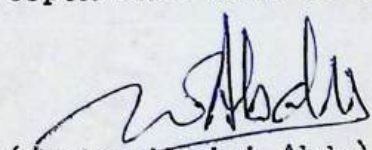
