CIRCULAR LETTER

SP/S: 389

29th May, 1970.

To All Military Governors of the States  
and the Administrator of East  
Central State



Your Excellencies,

I am very glad to be able to inform you that the Federal Military Government has approved the proposals of my Ministry for technical improvements to broadcasting throughout the Federation. Also approved in the programme is a financial allocation for the improvement of the external services. An expenditure of very nearly £3,000,000 is involved and the whole programme is to be completed over a period of 3 years beginning this financial year.

2. Under the programme it is the intention of the Federal Military Government to provide full sound broadcasting facilities in all the 12 States of the Federation; to adequately cover from each State headquarters the entire State and at the same time ensure that the national programmes of the N.B.C. are received clearly in all parts of the country over a network of medium wave transmitters supplemented, where necessary, by short wave transmitters. This will ensure for the first time continuous and good radio reception throughout the Federation.

3. It is proposed under the scheme that programmes originating from the national transmitters in Lagos, or from State transmitters when they are originating national programmes, will be transmitted simultaneously to all broadcasting stations in Nigeria via facilities of the Ministry of Communications in order to ensure the best possible reception conditions. But in order to ensure that programmes will not be lost when Ministry of Communications facilities break down, a new and powerful short wave transmitter will be installed in Lagos to ensure that satellite transmitting stations in the country will receive good signals from Lagos

/without

without interruption.

4. This programme is a highly technical one and requires close administrative and technical supervision for its early and proper implementation. Therefore, I have set up a high-powered committee under the name of "Project Implementation Committee on Broadcasting" to be directly responsible to me for its implementation. I intend from time to time to submit progress reports to the Head of the Federal Military Government and keep all Military Governors informed in order to ensure that they are fully aware of the progress being made and the difficulties that may arise. I consider it important that Your Excellencies should be made aware that the following provisional time-table for the implementation of the project has been drawn up:

5. It would appear from the above time-table that the commissioning of the first phase of the new installations cannot be before October 1971. Priority will be given to States which have no broadcasting facilities at present. I wish to assure Your Excellencies that everything possible will be done by the Committee and my Ministry to ensure the successful and earliest implementation of the programme.





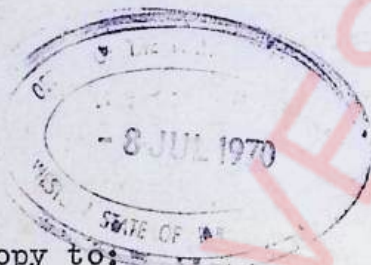

TEXT OF SPEECH DELIVERED BY THE ACTING  
COMMISSIONER FOR INFORMATION, MR. WENIKE  
BRIGGS, AT THE INAUGURAL MEETING OF THE  
N.B.C. COMMITTEE OF INQUIRY HELD IN THE  
COMMITTEE ROOM OF THE SENATE BUILDING  
AT 10 A.M. ON TUESDAY, 11TH AUGUST, 1970

Chairman and Members of the N.B.C. Committee of Inquiry,  
Gentlemen of the Press, Ladies and Gentlemen,

It gives me especial pleasure to welcome here the Chairman and Members of this Committee, which has been appointed to inquire into the operations of the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation. I say especial pleasure because I note that within two weeks of the announcement of the setting up of the Committee, it has started work in earnest. This augurs well, and if this sense of duty and devotion is followed tenaciously, I have no doubt that the Nigerian public will not have to wait for long to witness radical and satisfactory changes in the operations and effectiveness of the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation.

As you may well be aware, the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation was established from an arm of a Government Department in 1952 and converted into a Statutory Corporation in April, 1957. It has, therefore, survived three regimes in its 18 years of existence viz:- the colonial, the post-independence and the First Republican eras. With each succeeding regime, one would normally expect that changes in the policies of the Corporation would reflect the new attitudes and aspirations of the Nigerian people. The now historic creation by Decree of the 12 States in the Federation, therefore, would have posed intriguing problems for the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation both as respects its news coverage of the 12 States and its effectiveness as a unifying force in the country.

The Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation as you may have known, comprise a number of Departments each under a Director, or other

official of equal seniority at the National Headquarters of the Corporation. During the colonial and post-independence eras, the Corporation had similar set-ups each under what was generally known as Regional Controller. At the head of the organisation is the Director-General and Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation, who was answerable only to the Board of Directors of the Corporation for his actions.

Time came, however, when it was thought, perhaps, that it was necessary to give the Minister responsible for Broadcasting, powers of general or specific directions on matters of policy or matters appearing to the Minister to be of public interest. This feeling resulted in the enactment of the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation (Amendment) Act, 1961. Has the invocation or non-invocation of these powers had any salutary or adverse effects on the operations and resultant efficiency of the Corporation? Your Committee will find out.

The Corporation has come in for a spate of criticisms. Curiously enough, the N.B.C. Workers Associations at one time or another have been most consistent and vociferous in their demands for the appointment of a Commission to probe the operations of the Corporation. More recently, considerable dissatisfaction has been expressed publicly with the general performance of the Corporation. Criticisms have been made also by well-meaning citizens. These criticisms include allegations of gross inefficiency, nepotism, administrative and financial mismanagement, ineffectiveness of the Corporation as a unifying force and, not the least, injudicious appointment policies. If these allegations are substantiated, how best can the Corporation be given a re-birth and sufficiently re-activated to enable it disseminate news impartially, efficiently and ... also to reflect the true national feelings expected of it as a public organ? And in a somewhat different setting, let me refer to a recent incident.

/There were....

There were wide spread reports regarding the alleged incapability of the Corporation to remain impartial in the manner it handled the memorable October, 1965 Western Regional Elections which, it is alleged, irretrievably damaged the public image of the Corporation as an effective publicity medium. In that regard, would you conclude that the Corporation merely 'ran off the rails' or did it succumb to undue political pressures?

The above episode raises two fundamental issues. First, you might ask, have too much discretionary powers been concentrated in the hands of too few Executives of the Corporation: Or have the powers of direction in the policies of the Corporation referred to earlier, been judiciously used or otherwise? And this leads me to the second issue of whether or not Executives of the Corporation under the N.B.C. Act are sufficiently insulated from undue political interference or influence. These, Mr. Chairman, are some basic issues which will, no doubt, agitate your mind and to which your Committee will work assiduously to find lasting and satisfactory solutions.

To be able to resolve the above intriguing issues, you have to quote from the terms of your reference, "to review the objectives of the Corporation within the scope of its duties and functions, under the enactment establishing the Corporation, and assess the performance of the Corporation (within reasonable limitations) in the light of these objectives." In so doing, your Committee will go to great lengths to ascertain whether the Corporation indeed has the minimum of suitably qualified personnel desirable and, most importantly, whether it is provided with adequate and modern equipment necessary to properly discharge its arduous functions; for without these essential tools and technical know-how, the Corporation cannot but fail in its assignment inspite of all the goodwill in the world.

May I say a word or two regarding the composition of this Committee for the information of the general public. Of recent, the Federal Military Government has appointed a number of Commissions, Tribunals and Committees to examine and report on specific issues. Some of these bodies have quasi-judicial powers while others are simply fact-finding. The present Committee may be classified in the latter category. The selection of its members has not been based on mere considerations of their academic achievements.

Rather, the Chairman and four other Nigerian members of the panel are men who have, for a long time, taken an intelligent look at and a critical interest in the affairs of this country and especially in the way and manner in which these affairs and aspirations are reflected in our communications media. They have travelled widely in this country and outside it and are very knowledgeable in the current thinking on local and international affairs. Of the two expatriate members of the Committee, one is an expert of Broadcasting with many years experience in a country which, in many respects, faces similar problems as in Nigeria, while the other, it is expected, will bring his considerable experience of modern management techniques to the panel.

I have great hopes in the competence of this panel to discharge this sacred trust assigned to it to the glory of the nation. Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee, it is my ardent hope that out of this inquiry will emerge a new broad, intelligent and acceptable blue-print for Nigeria's premier Broadcasting organisation.



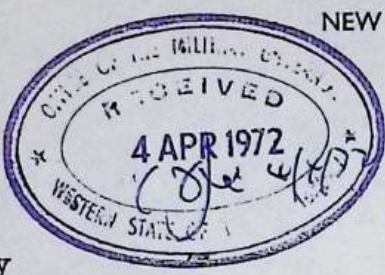

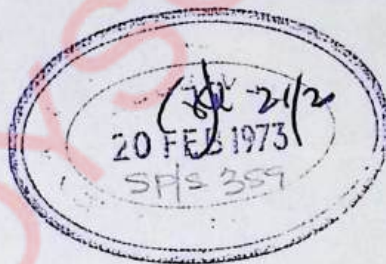

I have just received a copy of a letter entitled Protest Against Interventions dated 18th May, 1973, written by Moniya Farmers, c/o Alhaji Karimu Bandele, P.O.Box 178, Dugbe Market, Ibadan. The letter was forwarded to the above addressees in that order.

After reading through the contents, I feel constrained to keep you informed of the exact position of things.

The Ministry of Land and Housing estimated the compensation payable in respect of land and buildings on the site as N10,000 (£5,000) in their letter No. IS.893/41 of 4th August, 1972. As soon as the cheque for this amount was received from our Headquarters in Lagos, it was forwarded to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Lands and Housing, Western State, Ibadan, under our covering letter No. CW.513/122 of 12th September, 1972. Receipt was acknowledged through their IS.893/48 of 13th October, 1972.

In their IS.893/59 of 9th January, 1973, we were instructed to forward the Crop Enumeration Sheet to the Ministry of Lands and Housing when completed by the Ministry of Agriculture and Natural Resources. This instruction was complied with in our letter No. CW.513/136 of 25th January, 1973, and receipt of it was acknowledged by IS.893/83 of 1st February, 1973.

In the meantime, the summary of the Crop Enumeration List was forwarded to our Headquarters in Lagos for the compensation of N17,440.28 (£8,720.2.9d) to be made available.

Unfortunately, it was discovered that the Ministry of Agriculture and Natural Resources' total amount was ₦39.65 higher than it should be. The Ministry was asked to rectify this. The amended estimate for ₦17,429.63 (£8,714 16. 3d) was received on the 5th of May, 1973. The summary was sent to our Headquarters on the 8th of May, 1973, and the list was sent to the Ministry of Lands and Housing on the 10th of May, 1973. As soon as the cheque from our Headquarters is received, we shall forward same to the Ministry of Lands and Housing for their further action.

We hereby reassure you that we are quite prepared to pay adequate compensation for the lands we acquire. We have employed the services of the appropriate Ministries to ensure that the processes are properly handled.

Protest against Interventions

We the undersigned representing ourselves and very many other farmers in Moniya, Ibadan North District, very respectfully lay this matter before you and praying you to permit our request.

We are the farmers and owners of the acquired farmlands in Moniya area, and to us the Government had to pay the compensation attached thereto.

Of recent, we found out that some two of us namely Salawu Akinola and Muraina Eleshinmeta went and bargained with a Lawyer named Dele L. Aiku and a Notary Public to represent us the whole farmers to claim the compensations of all we the affected farmers, and to extract 80k. from every N2, leaving each farmer N1.20k. of each N2. payable.

Our information went further that they sought the assistance of one Mr. Solanke of the Controller's Office N.B.C. to facilitate easy withdrawal of all the compensations.

It is our candid opinion that the Government is, and would always be prepared to pay compensations directly to the owner of lands acquired, and not necessarily through any person or group of unauthorised persons.

In the first place, all the above named persons including the Lawyer whose introductory card happen to get into our hands, have never been authorised by us, and we are hereby protesting against their interventions and we would be grateful that they are ignored, and the Government to pay us directly.

We understand, that the said persons above mentioned planned that if our protest is accepted by you, they will organise grave breach of the peace and confusion and beatings on date of payments, to the effect that payments will be impossible. We pray for your help in this direction.



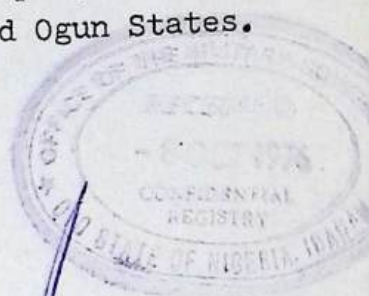

### 1. WHY MUST PEOPLE REGISTER ?

- (i) The Military Administration has promised to return Nigeria to Civil Rule in 1979 under a three-tier democratic system of Government -
  - (a) the Local Government System
  - (b) the 19-State Government Structure
  - (c) the Federal Government

Your Excellency,

At its meeting held on the 11th of February, 1978, the Board of Governors of the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation reviewed the contents of the various programmes as produced and radiated by its NBC State Stations.

The Board felt that in order to produce programmes that would be of more interest and benefit to the listeners within the State, there was the need to constitute a "State Programme Advisory Committee" which would advise the NBC State Controller.

I have been advised by my Director-General Mr. George Bako, that from 1/4/78 NBC stations in the States will no longer receive any financial reimbursements from their Headquarters in Lagos. Rather, the state stations will be financed entirely by the various State Governments.

I am therefore advised to seek your cooperation to ensure that all the financial commitments of this station (NBC Ibadan) including salaries/wages and other expenses are met by their due dates by the Oyo State Government.

The first bi-monthly salary payment falls due on Wednesday the 12th of April and this amounts to ₦6,286.00. The second monthly payment amount to ₦35,480.11 is due on the 21st of April, 1978.

Our weekly expenditure for other charges is on the average ₦12,000.00 inclusive of temporary staff salaries.

Throughout last year we were re-imbursed to the tune of ₦92,550.00 (Pensions inclusive) per month. It was expected that there would be a rise due to normal annual increments, expansion of programmes and other capital expenses.

We will therefore require a re-imbursment of about ₦120,000.00 monthly as an interim arrangement, pending the time I submit my comments on the draft estimates.



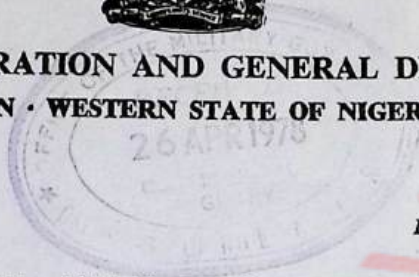

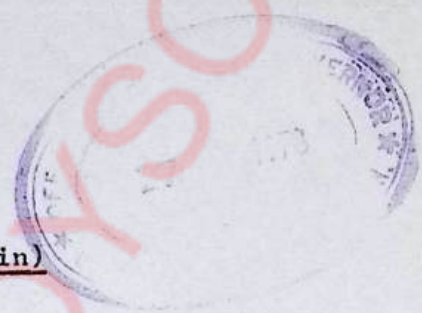

I was shocked this morning to receive your letter Ref.EST.2/3/78-79/142 dated 19th April, 1978 requesting me to refund the sum of N92,550.00 which you gave us as an emergency subvention last week.

As I stated when I made my request for the money, it was meant to meet an emergency - the payment of staff salaries/wages for April and for meeting other urgent expenses. The amount was the barest minimum to keep us going. We had asked for N120,000.00.

Salaries have been paid and other outstanding expenses like fuel, artiste fees and pensions claims have been met from this subvention.

I therefore find it impossible to refund any money now as it is not there physically. The banks have not been willing to grant us any overdraft.


I am therefore appealing to you to consider our plight as that of your child in need. If we are told later that our welfare is not the responsibility of the Oyo State Government, we shall ask whoever is our boss to make amend and refund the money.

Following your instructions, I wrote at p. 53 to the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development asking them not to make further payments to the N.B.C., Ibadan until all arrangements about the new broadcasting arrangements in the country are completed. I also requested the Ministry to ask the N.B.C. to refund the sum of ₦92,550 which was made available to them for the payment of staff salaries of the station for the month of April, 1978.

2. Kindly see the letter on p. 57 which contains the reaction of the State Controller of N.B.C. to the approach of the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development on the matter. The State Controller of N.B.C., Ibadan, vide p. 58, said that he was shocked to receive a letter asking for a refund of the amount given it as emergency subvention. He said the money has been spent and that it was impossible for him to refund the money as no <sup>ne</sup> money was available physically. The banks are not willing to grant his organisation any overdraft. He, therefore, appealed to the State Government to pity them as a child in need adding that, if later on, it is known that their welfare is not the responsibility of the Oyo State Government, who ever is their boss will be asked to amend and refund the money.

3. The Ministry of Finance is asking this office in its letter, to take up the matter on behalf of the Ministry with the State Controller of N.B.C., Ibadan and to keep them informed <sup>of</sup> for future developments.

4. I am surprised at the request of the Ministry of Finance that this office should now take on the refund of the money as part of our duties. Although the instruction to pay the amount emanated from this office, the money was actually <sup>paid</sup> by the Ministry of Finance and one would expect the Ministry, whose statutory duties it is to

receive and spend money on behalf of government, to find ways of getting this money back. As a matter of fact, I expect the Ministry not only to approach the State Controller of N.B.C., Ibadan which in any effect cannot have the funds to repay the money, but to approach <sup>the</sup> Head Office of the N.B.C. in Lagos for a refund of the money. It should be known to the Ministry that the estimates of the N.B.C. throughout the country is controlled from Lagos and not from Ibadan.

5. If you agree, on return of file, I intend to communicate this view to the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development, please.

4. Other Charges:

In Page 11 under Other Changes the NBC made a grossly inadequate provision of ₦127,612.00. I have asked for ₦635,409.00 to meet increased commitments.

5. Special Expenditure:

A cursory look at page 12 of the NBC draft will reveal the inadequate provision for Capital Expenditure referred to as Special Expenditure. I have asked for ₦600,000.00 instead. (copy attached).

At pp. 250 - 258 I minuted to Y.E. recalling the decision of NCS/SMC that States affected by the take-over of radio stations with short-wave and powerful medium wave transmitters should make financial provisions for the recommendations contained in the report of the Panel set up by the Federal Military Government on the matter. The Panel's report was summarised in the minutes referred to above.



May I recall that the basis of the Panel's work is that the take-over will be with effect from 1st April, 1978 and this was stressed at the last NCS meeting when it was also directed that the States should start carrying the recurrent expenditure of the radio stations to be taken over by them. As a follow-up, the Controller of N.B.C., Ibadan wrote on April 11, saying that the Director-General of N.B.C. has advised him that N.B.C. stations in the States will no longer receive any financial reimbursements from their Headquarters in Lagos and that the State stations will be financed entirely by the various State Governments. This means that from 1st April, 1978 the Oyo State Govt. should start paying the salaries and wages of the staff of N.B.C.

Page <sup>61</sup> contains a letter addressed to the S.M.G. & H.S. in which the Controller of N.B.C. Station, Ibadan stated that the Federal Military Government had decided that radio Station should be financed by Oyo State Government. He therefore appealed to the S.M.G. & H.S. to use his good offices to ensure that a minimum monthly subvention of ₦92,550.00 is paid to the Corporation.

2. In the photocopy of the minute at pages <sup>79 & 80</sup> 19 & 20, the S.M.G. & H.S. disclosed that arrangement was made to release the amount of money requested for in paragraph 1, which was used to pay the salaries and wages of the staff of the Corporation for the month of April, 1978. He further disclosed that following the directives of the Exco, steps were taken to recover the money already paid to the Corporation.

3. In view of the fact that action has been taken on the issue in the main file, I, humbly suggest that we do not bring the information to the notice of the S.M.G. & H.S.

4. Pages <sup>62 & 63</sup> ~~2 & 3~~ contain another letter from the Controller of N.B.C., Ibadan. In the letter, he offered his comments on the N.B.C. 1978/79 Budget proposal <sup>which</sup> he claimed to have submitted to this office. The Controller would like the designation of the Chief Executive to change from Director to General Manager and Assistant Directors to Directors. He disclosed that Management expenses were omitted from the N.B.C. draft. His proposal on this is attached as Head 20. On the staff structure, he would like additional hands to be employed because of the anticipated increase in their volume of work. According to him, the proposed increase in staff establishment would cost ₦416,506.00. He said that under other charges, the N.B.C. made a grossly inadequate provision of ₦127,612.00. He is now asking for ₦600,000.00.


5. I wish to comment on the proposed increase in staff establishment submitted at pages <sup>69 to 77</sup> ~~9 - 17~~. I think this office has to scrutinise the proposal after knowing details of staff movement of both the Radio O-Y-O and the N.B.C., Ibadan.



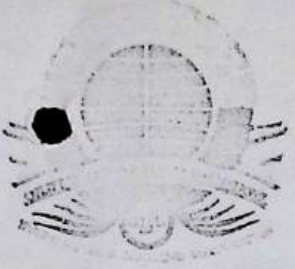

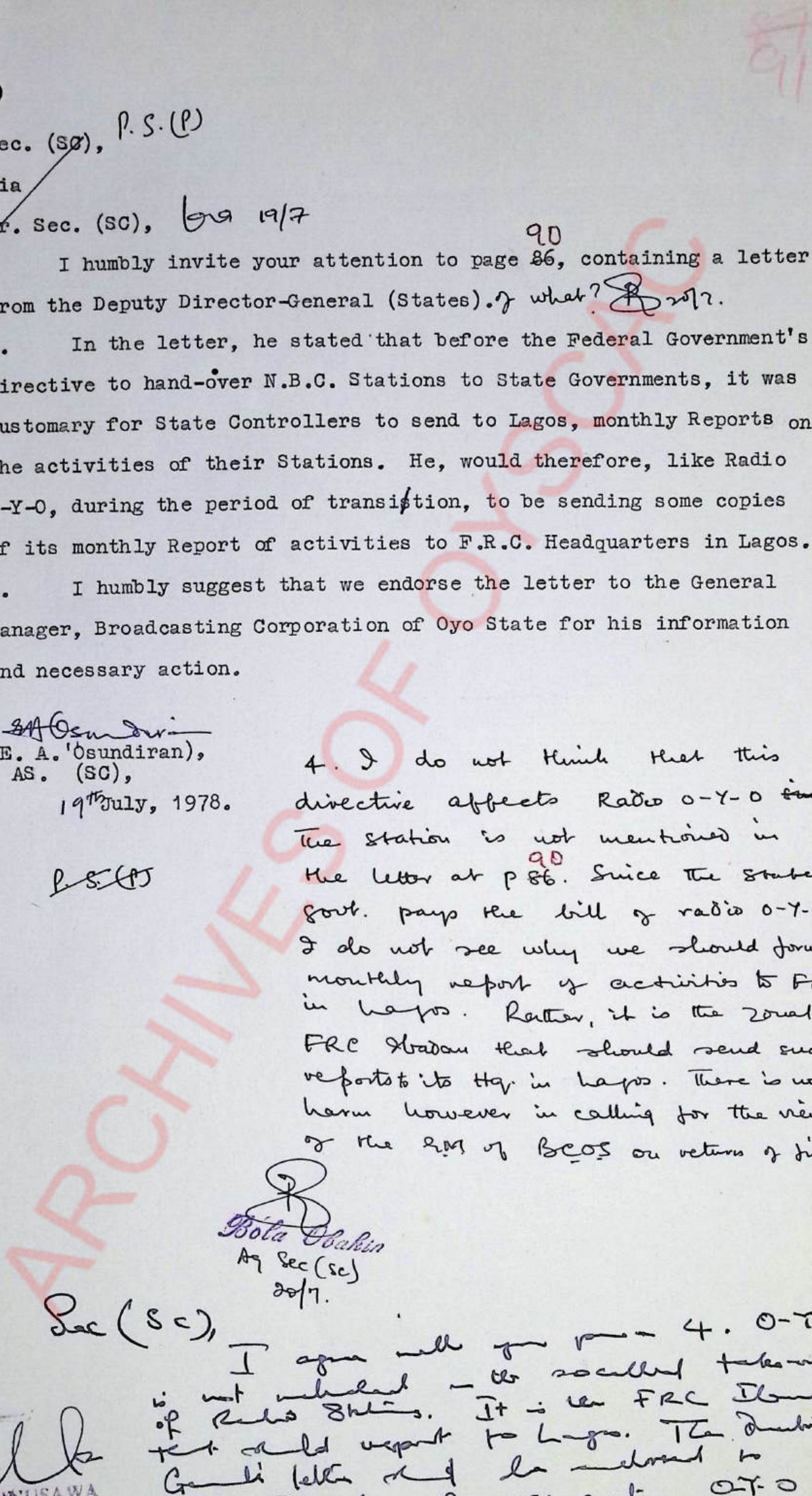

We are being intimated at p. <sup>103</sup> that the Deputy Director-General State Services of the Federal Radio Corporation, Mr. Horatio Agedah will be visiting Ibadan on Monday 4th Sept., 1978. He would like to pay a courtesy call on your goodself at 10 a.m. that day. Kindly confirm whether the date and time is convenient for you to meet Mr. Agedah.

2. No indication is given that the visitor would discuss any topic but one can see him raising the question of radio O-Y-O relaying F.R.C.s news bulleting at certain times of the day. Our position is that, it is not necessary. There is also the point that periodic progress reports be rendered by radio O-Y-O to F.R.C.'s Headquarters in Lagos. Again, we have taken the position that since the Oyo State Govt. funds the station entirely from its own resources, it is the State Govt. alone that should receive progress reports from the management of the radio station. Of recent also, the G.M. of O-Y-O has raised the question of refunding some money spent on Alaho and Bashorun transmitters now handed over to F.R.C. The amount has not been quantified and we can ask Mr. Adeleke to supply figures. Finally, you may wish to raise the issue of handing over the N.B.C. transmitter along old Ife road to radio O-Y-O as part of the take over package.

3. If you agree, on return of file, I would ask the authorities of Radio O-Y-O to prepare a short paper on the points raised above for your use during the call.

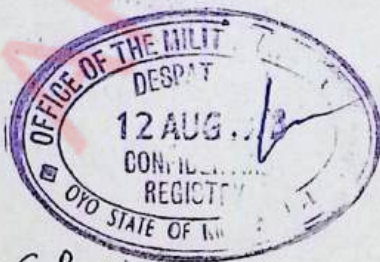



1. Please refer to your letter SP/S.389/101 of 11 August 1978 on the above. The discussions with Mr Agedah may involve the following:

### 2. Technical

Radio O-Y-O on the directives of Government has handed over the following "offensive" transmitters in accordance with Federal guidelines on the re-organisation of Radio Broadcasting in Nigeria:

- a. 2 x 100 KW Medium Wave transmitters at Alaho
- b. 50 KW Short Wave transmitter at Orita Bashorun, Ibadan.

\* 3. The Oyo State Government is to have the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation transmitters at Ife Road, like other State Governments which have taken over the assets/liabilities of the former Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation within their areas of authority. The Federal Radio Corporation is however yet to make these facilities available to Radio O-Y-O even though they have been given access by us to our own "offensive" transmitters as stated in 2 above.

\* 4. It is also pertinent to note that the Federal Radio Corporation has sought our permission to order some modifications to the equipment in 2 (a) and (b) above. We have no objections to this and wish that such permission be conveyed at the meeting.

### 5. Costs

\* (i) The 2 x 100 KW Medium Wave transmitters at Alaho was installed at a cost of ₦2.1 million including buildings, 2 No. 750 K.V.A. generators, airconditioning and other improvements.

\* (ii) The 50 KW Short Wave transmitter at Orita Bashorun costs ₦500,000 (five hundred thousand naira). Disbursements have been virtually completed by irrevocable letters of credit in respect of both transmitting equipment.

6. Although there are indications at various meetings in Lagos that the Federal Government may not pay compensations, it is important to press

the issue with Mr Agedah. Although some payments have been made to Radio O-Y-O by the Federal Radio Corporation in respect of disbursements made by us since 1 April 1978, the legal date of the take-over exercise, this is not connected with compensation.

#### 7. News Relay

By your letter reference no. SP/C.205/II/526 of 9 August 1978, (attached as Appendix IA), we have instructions not to relay FRC news. In fact this letter is in line with our suggestion in the attached letter marked Appendix IB. As an autonomous Radio Corporation, we have no legal or other formal links with FRC and to relay the news from Lagos will detract from our autonomy and independent identity.

#### 8. Staff Options

\* As part of the reorganisation of Radio Broadcasting in Nigeria, all broadcast staff were given the right to opt for any Radio Station of their choice. As a result 44 (fourty-four) members of the staff of Radio O-Y-O opted for Service with FRC. In return about 90 (ninety) of FRC staff, largely from Oyo State opted for Radio O-Y-O from various parts of the country. Both categories of staff are anxious to move to the Radio Stations of their choice. But while the cases of the twenty-two other Radio Services in the country have been resolved, FRC would not accept the options of Radio O-Y-O staff. \* The argument is that Radio O-Y-O as a whole was not taken over; that only its offensive transmitters were acquired by the Federal Government. It is however important to resolve this matter immediately in view of the immense psychological effect which it has on the staff concerned on both sides. In fact this can be done before 1 October 1978, when the staff options will be given effect.

#### 9. Periodic Accounts


Radio O-Y-O is not part of the FRC Structure and is therefore not expected to reuder any periodic reports of its operations to FRC Headquarters, Lagos. Only the four Zonal Stations of the FRC in Ibadan (formerly NBC, New Court Road), Enugu, Kaduna and Lagos are required to furnish such periodic reports.

#### 10. Summary

It is important to emphasise that FRC should hand over the Ife Road transmitters to Radio O-Y-O. It is also suggested that the issue of paying Radio O-Y-O for facilities taken over and especially for the balances on capital expenditures incurred by us on the "offensive" transmitters since April 1978, be pursued rigorously. The amount outstanding for which requests have been made to FRC is about ₦200,000 (two hundred thousand naira). We also want the issue of staff options as it affects Radio O-Y-O to be resolved without further delay. Above all, the autonomy and independence of Radio O-Y-O should be re-emphasised.

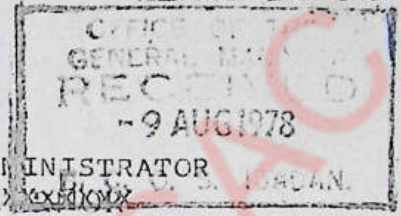

**SCHEDULE OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PANEL  
ON THE TAKE-OVER OF SHORTWAVE AND MEDIUM WAVE  
RADIO STATIONS IN THE COUNTRY**

1. I refer to the attached schedule of Implementation of the Report of the Panel on the Federal Government take-over of certain Radio Stations which is purported to have been approved by the Supreme Military Council and the Council of States sometime in May this year. I wish, in particular, to draw your attention to the paragraph relating to News on Page 1.
2. We interpret the recommendation to be optional or discretionary on the part of State-owned Radio services. We therefore suggest that Radio O-Y-O should not compromise its autonomy and its distinctive character by relaying FRC news. All along as a State government-owned radio station, Radio O-Y-O has had no relationship with either the erstwhile Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation (NBC) or the present Federal Radio Corporation of Nigeria (FRC). To create such a relationship by relaying FRC network news from Lagos may have very many far-reaching social and political implications.
3. Radio O-Y-O, an offshoot of the Western Nigeria Broadcasting Services, has always had several slots for national and international news bulletins daily. This is why Radio O-Y-O has representatives



not only in Lagos but also in other major towns of the Federation. And as a State-owned Radio, it has emphasised grassroot programmes by having 20 (twenty) news bulletins in the Yoruba language per day. There are twenty-two such bulletins in English. Even the Federal Radio Corporation itself does not have as many as forty-two bulletins daily!

4. Therefore, since our present news productions take adequate care of State, National and International news materials, "hooking on" to the Federal Radio Corporation network news may not be in our interest.

5. We however await your directives on this issue.

In anticipation of the issues that may likely come up for discussion when Mr. Moratio Agedah of the Federal Radio Corporation pays a courtesy call on your good self next Monday, 4th September, 1978, the General Manager of the Broadcasting Corporation of Oyo State (BCOS) was requested to prepare a brief on some points of general interest - especially with regard to the recent re-organisation of radio broadcasting in the country.

2. As a follow-up, the GM., BCOS, submitted the brief on pp. ~~102-103~~<sup>111-112</sup>, which deals with the following issues:

(a) Radio Transmitters:

(i) While this State Govt. had handed over to the Federal Radio Corporation (FRC.) the 2 x 100 KW Medium Wave transmitters at Alaho and the 50 KW Short Wave transmitter at Orita Bashorun, Ibadan, the FRC. has not transferred the NBC. transmitters at Ife Road to this State Govt.

*See p. 119*

(ii) This State Govt. has also given permission to the FRC. to effect necessary modifications to the transmitters at Alaho and Orita Bashorun already handed over to it.

(b) Compensation for Transmitters handed over: It has cost this State Govt. a total sum of N2.6 million to instal the transmitters at Alaho and Orita Bashorun - both stations already handed over to the FRC. It is our considered opinion that the State Govt. should be fully compensated for the equipments thus taken over.

(c) News Relay: That Radio O-Y-O, being an autonomous and independent organisation, is not being expected to hook on to the FRC. network news. Radio O-Y-O already had its own

daily slots for State, National and International news bulletins; hence, its representatives are stationed in all the major towns in the Federation.

(d) Staff Options: Following the re-organisation of Radio Broadcasting, the broadcast staff of all radio stations were given the right to opt for the station of their individual choice. As a result, 44 officials of Radio O-Y-O opted for service with FRC., while 90 of the FRC staff opted for Radio O-Y-O. While the issue of such movement of the staff had been resolved in most parts of the Federation, the FRC. was unwilling to accept the options of the staff of Radio O-Y-O, on the ground that the Federal Govt. had not taken over Radio O-Y-O as a whole as such but only its offensive transmitters. This issue may have to be resolved once and for all.

(e) Periodic Reports: Radio O-Y-O is not part of the FRC. system and is, therefore, not expected to render reports for its activities to the FRC. Headquarters in Lagos.

3. The above brief may be found useful when Mr. Agedah pays courtesy call on you. You may, however, wish to direct that the GM., BCOS., be invited to attend the meeting with Mr. Agedah. In view of the fact that Monday, 4th and Tuesday, 5th September, 1978 have been declared as public holiday, however, it may be necessary that Mr. Agedah be advised to choose a new date for the courtesy call.





You took serious note of the fact that the General Manager of the State Broadcasting Corporation (BCOS) was conspicuously absent at the meeting you held with Mr. Horatio Agedah when the latter paid a courtesy call on you on Thursday, 7th September, 1978 - vide your min. on p. ~~112~~<sup>121</sup>. Your observation was accordingly brought to the notice of the General Manager in our letter on p. ~~113~~<sup>122</sup>.

2. In fact, I called on Mr. Faleti, Acting General Manager, early that Thursday to intimate him of the proposed visit of Mr. Agedah later that day, having regard to the fact that Mr Kunle Adeleke was on leave and might find it impossible to attend the meeting. If, however, I advised further, he did not see Mr. Agedah by 10.00 a.m. that day, he should show up in the office of the SMG. & HS. Having promised to take to my advice, I left his office.

3. The defence put up by Mr. Faleti in his letter at p. ~~116~~<sup>125</sup> would appear not tenable, having regard to the discussion I had with him on the day of the visit - especially that he should show up in your office by 10.00 a.m. even if Mr. Agedah did not call on him before visiting the SMG. & HS. In any case, your observation had been communicated to him and, by now, he would have realised his mistake which, I hope, he would try to ~~guide~~<sup>guard</sup> against in future. It would ~~be~~ even appear not necessary to have told the General Manager before making it a point of duty to attend such an important meeting which has bearing~~s~~ with the functions, and even continued existence, of his organisation. Mr. Faleti's plea may be acceptable on the ground that he was not briefed on the visit by Mr. Adeleke


before the latter went on leave. He had the impression that Mr. Adeleke would personally attend.




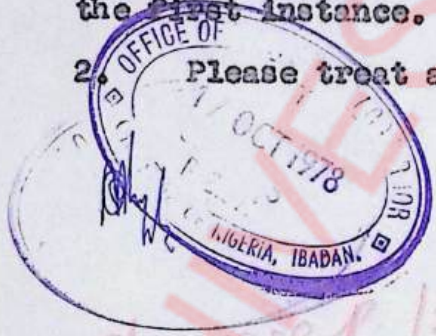

I respectfully invite your attention to page 136 which contains a letter from the General Manager Broadcasting Corporation of Oyo State. It is a reply to the letter on page 135 which is a follow up of your minute on page 134. The letter is about the refund of ₦92,550.00 loan advanced to Federal Radio Corporation of Nigeria by Oyo State Ministry of Finance and Economic Development.

2. The General Manager B.C.O.S. has confirmed vide page 136, that the said amount had been received by the Corporation. It was further stated that F.R.C.N. Ibadan is still owing the Corporation approximately ₦500,000 which is yet to be recovered. The General Manager then stated that the amount of ₦92,550 will be refunded to the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development as soon as payment is received from F.R.C.N. Ibadan.

3. 1. Please refer to your letter SP/S.389/I/139 of 16 November 1978 on the above. Perhaps it should be further explained that no payment was specifically made to this Corporation by FRCN in respect of the ₦92,550.00 loan granted to it by the State Government. In the course of exchanging accounts with FRCN for various services rendered by Radio O-Y-O on behalf of the Federal Government and by the NBC ostensibly on behalf of the Oyo State Government, certain monies were paid to the BCOS. There are still substantial sums of these monies due to this Corporation from FRCN.
  2. Outstanding bills, even in respect of recurrent expenditures, apart from disbursements for capital projects, now taken over by the Federal Government, have been forwarded to the authorities of the FRCN in Ibadan. We have however not succeeded in getting them to meet their commitments to us.
  3. Your office is well aware of these problems. It is in fact on record that on 15 November 1978, the Secretary to the Military Government and Head of Service, Mr M S Adigun, at a meeting with the Administrator, attended by my Chairman and myself, indicated that he has been trying very hard, but unsuccessfully, to get the Federal Government to pay outstanding bills due to us.
  4. The intention, I wish to restate, is that when all the accounts between us and FRCN are settled, Radio O-Y-O, as the Broadcasting Agent of the State Government, will make a refund of the loan to the State Treasury. In fact, the sum of ₦92,550.00 should be seen as part of several other sums of money due to Radio O-Y-O from FRCN. Since a large part of these monies are still outstanding with FRCN, we do not think that it would be very correct to say that this Corporation converted the money in dispute to its use without permission from your office.

5. Finally, I wish to appeal once again to you to assist us in retrieving debts owed to us by the Federal Radio Authorities.
